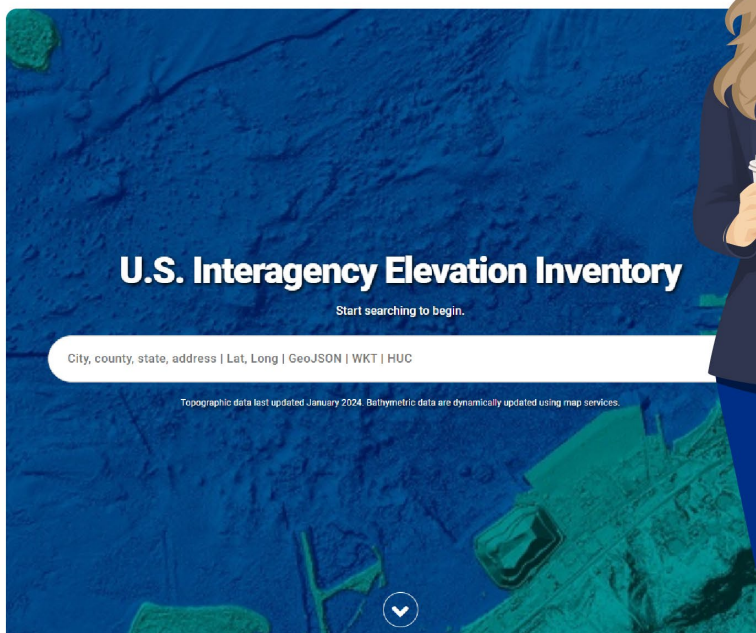

The U.S. Interagency Elevation Inventory

Why Rebecca loves it: [This resource](#) makes it easier for everyone from government agencies to individual researchers to find and use elevation data across the United States and its territories. It's a one-stop shop that includes completed and in-progress public domain elevation data.

What makes it so great: The inventory is updated every quarter through a partnership of federal agencies, which ensures everyone has the latest information available. Users can download this data in two different formats—Esri File Geodatabase format or Open Geospatial Consortium GeoPackage format—or use it directly in their own software tools via map services.

Plan Ahead for High Tide Flooding

Road closures, storm drain overflows, or even damage to community infrastructure are all potential impacts from high tide flooding. 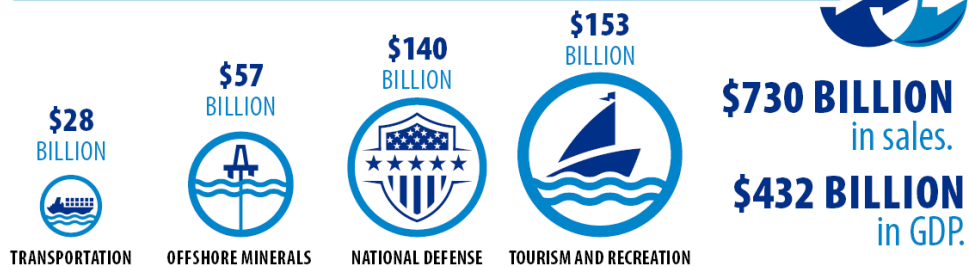
